

*123 firearm deaths *35 homicides *88 (over 70%) suicides * 5 of those deaths were children.



Gun Disposal

The U.S. Civilian Gun Stock Has Grown Significantly

In 2021, the total number of guns produced for the U.S. market reached 474 million. The number in circulation is lower due to attrition, but by how many is unclear.

* Gun Stock in the U.S. Doubled since 1990 *1.4 guns per person

* Unwanted guns can be used by a municipality * Can be sold to a licensed dealer * Can be sent to MSP for destruction

* Some states: Unwanted guns cannot be destroyed *9+ states mandate unwanted guns be sold, not destroyed * Some municipalities prevent sale of unwanted guns: prevent resurfacing in crimes


John 52, Virginia

John has been unemployed for the last few years and suffering with depression. He owns several firearms but wants to get rid of them, partly for his own safety but also because of the wider harms he sees in the news. He is concerned about what others misusing them, so doesn't want to sell them.

"If you sell it to a gun shop, they're going to sell it to someone else, and is that really achieving the goal? I don't have it anymore, but somebody else does."

"uncomfortable selling it to someone else without knowing what they're capable of"

"I've contacted three local police agencies, none of them want to take them."



Kelly, 41, Pennsylvania

Mother of three small children. Her partner recently passed away following a violent altercation. He left several firearms hidden in her home. She wants to dispose of them but does not know how. She has reservations about contacting the law enforcement.

"They going to question you, where'd you find it, check your hands to see if you got a criminal background. Next thing, you're being made to look like a criminal."



Shane, 31, Nevada

Army veteran who attended the Las Vegas mass shooting 2017. This experience prompted him to want to destroy his firearms. Researched various options (e.g. buybacks, amnesties). Wanted to ensure his firearms were destroyed NOT sold. Now keeps firearms in storage

"It's actually harder to get rid of a gun than it is to get one"

"I wouldn't feel comfortable knowing that it could go into somebody's hands and eventually end up on the street"

"I came to accept the fact that I was stuck with it".
